



Contractor Safety Checklist

- Plan jobs before starting them.
- Determine what could go wrong with a task—and how to prevent it.
- Check that all tools and equipment are functioning properly before use.
- Be continually alert to safety hazards.
- Correct or report any safety hazard immediately.
- Keep area clean and neat, and practice good hygiene.
- Read container label and safety data sheet (SDS) before handling a chemical—and follow stated precautions.
- Operate machines only when guards are in place and only if authorized.
- Follow lockout/tagout procedures for machine repair or maintenance.
- Use personal protective equipment (PPE) whenever required, and inspect it to ensure it is in good condition before each use.
- Select the right tool for the job, and follow safety rules and manufacturer's instructions for their use.
- Don't fool around or cut corners on the job.
- Keep your mind focused on your work and avoid distractions.
- Report accidents, injuries, illnesses, exposure to hazardous substances, or near misses immediately.
- Respond quickly to emergency alarms, and follow your assigned evacuation route.
- Ask questions whenever you're unsure about a hazard or safety procedure.
